

Emergency Broadband Benefit

April 30, 2021

Beginning May 12, 2021, eligible households will be able to apply for the [Emergency Broadband Benefit Program](#) (EBB). The program, which is temporary, will provide eligible consumers a discount up to \$50 a month off the cost of broadband service and associated equipment rentals. All eligible households may also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 toward the cost of a laptop, desktop or tablet computer purchased from a participating broadband provider, subject to a modest copay requirement.

The EBB Program will conclude when the fund is expended or six months after the end of the COVID-19 pandemic, whichever occurs first. A link to the Public Notice and related materials can be found [here](#).

A household is eligible if a member of the household meets one of the criteria below:

- Has an income that is at or below 135% of the [Federal Poverty Guidelines](#) or participates in certain assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid, or [Lifeline](#);
- Approved to receive benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school breakfast program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision in the 2019-2020 or 2020-2021 school year;
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year;
- Experienced a substantial loss of income due to job loss or furlough since February 29, 2020 and the household had a total income in 2020 at or below \$99,000 for single filers and \$198,000 for joint filers; or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income or COVID-19 program.

Beginning on May 12 households can apply in three ways:
